DAY 1 | 3rd January 2020

[SINGAPORE >> DELHI == SANKASHYA]

BLD

[> SIN-DEL SQ402 0225/0555]

Arrive at New Delhi Indira Gandhi International Airport. After breakfast, visit Delhi museum to view and pay respect to Buddha relic. After museum, journey to Sankashya. Check in hotel at Sankashya

DAY 2 | 4th January 2020 [SANKASHYA 🖷 LUCKNOW 🖷 SHRAVASTI] BLD

After breakfast, visit Sankashya, where Lord Buddha descended from Tushita Heaven after giving teaching to his mother Queen Mayadevi, who had died seven days after Buddha's birth and been reborn as a male god in Tushita. It is the most westward and perhaps most obscure of the eight places of pilgrimage is Sankashya, whose name may derive from a stupa built there by Kashyapa Buddha's father and dedicated to his son. This is the last of the four places common to the Buddha's of this world. Group will check-in late evening into hotel in Shravasti.

DAY 3 | 5th January 2020

SHRAVASTI 🖷 KAPILAVASTU 🖷 LUMBINI

BLD

After breakfast, visit Jetavana Grove - where Buddha spent twenty-five rainy seasons there and also performed many great miracles, and spend some time at Ananda Bodhi Tree. Next, en-route to Kapilavastu - the capital of the Sakyas, where the Lord Buddha spent the first thirty years of his life. After lunch, cross border to Lumbini, Nepal.

DAY 4 | 6th January 2020 [LUMBINI] BLD

After Breakfast, visit Maya Devi Temple and Ashoka Pillar. Lumbini was the birthplace of the Buddha and is now located near the Nepal-India border north of Gorakpur. It is the place which should be visited and seen by a person of devotion and which should cause awareness and apprehension of the nature of impermanence. It is said in the Parinibbana Sutta that Buddha himself identified the four key sites of future pilgrimage - the sites of his birth, enlightenment, first discourse, and death.

DAY 5 | 7th January 2020 [LUMBINI | KUSHINAGAR] BLD

After early breakfast, depart to Kushinagar.. After lunch, proceed with the sightseeing tour of Kushinagar - Buddha's last journey led him to Kushinagar, where he passed into Mahaparinirvana. The famous sites are Mahaparinirvana temple and Ramabhar Stupa where Buddha was cremated. Also visits the Muktabandhana Stupa built by Malla Dynasty to house Buddha's relics after the cremation

DAY 6 | 8th January 2020 [KUSHINAGAR 🖶 VAISHALI 🖶 RAJGIR] BLD

After breakfast, depart to Rajgir, but en-route to Vaishali to visit the famous for Buddha Stupa and Ashoka Pillar. Vaishali was where the Second Buddhist Council was held after 100 years of Buddha's Parinirvana. At Kothua, Lord Buddha delivered his last sermon. Later, Emperor Ashoka erected a huge pillar to commemorate the spot of the last sermon. Lunch at Vashali. and continue journey to Rajgir.

DAY 7 | 9th January 2020

[RAJGIR 🖷 NALANDA 🖷 RAJGIR]

BLD

Morning after breakfast, proceed to the ruins of Nalanda University - one of the oldest ancient Universities of the world & International Centre for Buddhist Studies. The University complex founded in 5th century BC, was a full-fledged university till 12th century when it was plundered and destroyed by the Afghans invaders from northwest. After lunch, we will head toward Vulture's Peak where Lord Buddha set forth the second turning of Dharma 16 years after his enlightenment to an assembly of 5,000 monks, nuns, laity, as well as innumerable bodhisattvas. The collection of teachings, which extended over 12 years, includes the Saddharmapundarika Sutra and the Surangama Samadhi Sutra, as well as many Prajnaparamita Sutras, which contain the very essence of all Buddha's teachings. After Vulture's Peak, we will visit Shrataparna Cave where the first Buddhist council after the Buddha attained Nirvana was held there with an assembly of 500 monks presided over by Mahakashyapa and compiled the Buddha's teachings into a collection known as the Sthaviranikaya.

DAY 8 | 10th January 2020 [RAJGIR 🖷 BODHGAYA]

BLD

After breakfast, proceed to Bodhgaya - the site where Buddha attained Enlightenment under a Bodhi tree. On the way, we will visit Mahakala cave that Buddha spent first week of ascetic meditation after leave leaving Raigir from his second teaching in the search for the truth.. After lunch at hotel, visit the various monasteries - Thai, Korean, Japanese and Sri Lankan we will also visit the Tibetan Monastery with slopping tiled roofs, an architectural style similar to the monasteries in Tibet,

DAY 9 | 11th January 2020 [BODHGAYA]

BLD

After breakfast, start the day with a sightseeing tour of the religious town revered both by the Buddhists and Hindus alike. Visit to the Mahabodhi Temple, well known for its Bodhi tree, where Gautama attained supreme knowledge and attain Buddhahood. The tree stands today is believed have grown from the original Pepal tree under which lord Buddha meditated. After lunch, visit to Sujata Village.

DAY 10 | 12th January 2020 [BODHGAYA]

BLD

We will start the day with meditation at the Mahabodhi Temple. After meditation, free and easy.

DAY 11 | 13th January 2020 [BODHGAYA 📮 VARANASI]

BLD

After breakfast, depart to Varanasi. After lunch at hotel, visit Sarnath where Buddha turned the First Wheel of Dharma, it was also here at Sarnath that Buddha turned 12 Wheels of Dharma. At the deer park he disclosed the truth to his first five disciples. Dhamek Stupa marked the spot of the Buddha's first sermon. Here one can see the chankrama where Buddha walked in meditation. The ruins dated back to the time of Emperor Ashoka such as the lion headed pillar can be seen nearby. At Sarnath Museum, there is a remarkable statue of Buddha setting the wheel of law in motion.

DAY 12 | 14th January 2020 [VARANASI >> DELHI >> SINGAPORE]

Early morning, head to take a boat cruise on river Ganges. The western banks of Ganges has a string of Ghats - the chain of stone steps, are all built with pavilions, palaces and terraces, most of which are mainly used as Dharamsalas where the pilgrims stay during their visit to the holy city. At dawn, the Ghats are buzz with activity of the devotees performing their ablutions in the river or offering prayers to the rising sun and performing other religious rituals. A boat ride along the Ghats give you vantage view of this activity. The sunrise on the Ganges is a soul-lifting experience. After the Ganges, visit to the Vishwanath temple, also known as the Golden Temple because of the gold plating on its roof. After lunch, proceed airport for flight back to Delhi. Dinner in Delhi before the flight back home.
